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Other information to NKK from veterinarian

1. Information to the dog's owner

The radiographs of your dog will be sent to the Norwegian Kennel Club (NKK). After the radiographs have been received, they will be evaluated, and the owner of the dog will be notified of the result in a letter or e-mail. The result will not be published in NKK's data register, since the dog is not registered in the Norwegian Kennel Club. However, the results will be accessible for the respective breed clubs, where these exist, for use in the club's breeding work and for the veterinarian conducting the radiographic examination, and can be published.

The processing time is up to 6 weeks from the time NKK receives the radiographs and the payment is registered. Following evaluation, the radiographs will be stored at NKK for 5 years, after which they will be destroyed.

All dogs are required to be ID-marked, at the latest at the time of the radiographic examination, in order for the radiographs to be evaluated.

2. Question for the owner of the registered dog

I hereby confirm that the stated dog is NOT registered or in the process of being registered in the Norwegian Kennel Club, and that the dog is living in a foreign country. For any subsequent registration at NKK, I understand that a new radiographic examination and evaluation is required in order for the result to be registered.

3. Consent from national kennel club

NKK is bound by international agreements, and a dog is supposed to be X-rayed and evaluated in the country where it is registered (and live). However, for dachshunds that is often not possible. We therefore want to help to evaluate the X-rays for dogs from other countries, but we need the consent of the national kennel club. We have consent from the following countries and their respective kennel clubs:

- Sweden
- UK (The Kennel Club)
- Belgium

For other countries, the owner or breed club must in advance contact the national kennel club, and ask whether or not they object to the Norwegian Kennel Club administrating the evaluation of X-rays for dogs registered in their country.

4. Fees and payment

The evaluation can be pay for online. Unfortunately, the online instructions are in Norwegian, but attached to this form is an English instruction on how to proceed (see page 3).

NKK reserves the right to changes in fees. The correct fee is found in the latest edition of Hundesport and on our website www.nkk.no. The correct fee is calculated by the system if you have paid for the evaluation on our website.

5. Conditions

With my signature, I confirm and accept the conditions stated for evaluation at the Norwegian Kennel Club, and that the dog examined is the same dog that has the registration and ID number that is stated in this form. If the dog is not registered, I hereby certify that the dog has the ID number that is stated in this form.
